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20 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

22 Minutes of the September 20, 2018 Trails Committee meeting were reviewed. Sunny
23 Larson made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Matt Johnson seconded the motion,
24 which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

26 Minutes of the September 26, 2018 Joint Planning Commission/Trails Committee Work
27 Session were reviewed. Blair Parrish made a **motion** to approve the minutes as amended by the
28 Planning Commission. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote
29 (5-0).

31 At 8:10 p.m., Rick Turner arrived at the meeting.

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33 **TRAILSIDE PLANNING**

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35 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported Cory Snyder, City Planner, is
36 requesting the Trails Committee, and the Parks and Recreation Committee review the information
37 that will be emailed to see if there are additional uses for the hillside property. Robyn Mecham,
38 City Council Liaison, reported she talked with Mr. Snyder, and he wants the Trails Committee to
39 review if there should be more trails. With the Active Transportation Plan, Bruce Cox would like
40 each Committee to adopt capital improvement plans, and identify how the use and management of
41 the land completes with the Active Transportation Plan. Each Committee is to provide a written
42 summary to the City Council for their input on the foothills property by February 1, 2019. The
43 Master Plan states the hillside property should be used for recreational uses and not developed into
44 residential uses. This same information is being requested of the Parks and Recreation Committee.

1 An ADHOC Committee will be formed from residents in the community, and from members of
2 the Parks and Trails Committees. The items to be discussed will be the gun range, ATV use, and
3 trails for mountain biking and running.

4
5 **REPORT ON ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN**

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7 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported Alta Planning was awarded the bid for
8 the Active Transportation Plan. As part of this plan, a count of walkers, runners, and cyclists will
9 be taken on November 17th and December 1st in two hour blocks. Centerville's location for the
10 counts will be 400 West and Pages Lane, and Parrish Lane and Main Street.

11
12 At 8:33 p.m., Matt Johnson was excused from the meeting.

13
14 The Committee discussed turn lanes and wider bike lanes on the Frontage Road and Main
15 Street. Robyn Mecham, City Council Liaison, reported the new Davis Corridor Interchange will
16 start at Lund Lane, which will affect the Frontage Road. An Active Transportation Plan Steering
17 Committee will be formed from the three cities. Trails Committee members are needed to serve
18 on the Active Transportation Plan Steering Committee.

20 **DISCUSS TRAIL POSSIBILITIES USING MAP WITH PROPERTY**
21 **INFORMATION**

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23 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, displayed an aerial map that shows the property
24 lines on the hillside. The Committee discussed where potential trails could be located and
25 connected with other trails.

26
27 **VOLUNTEER PROJECTS REPORT**

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29 Rick Turner reported four volunteer projects were completed in the past month. There were
30 30 to 50 hours of labor given to complete these projects. More work will need to be done on the
31 Freedom Hills Trail. A Boy Scout group doing an Order of the Arrow service project on the
32 Freedom Hills Trail did not have proper supervision, and they caused some damage on the trail.
33 The City was not aware of this service project, so there was no one from the City to give
34 instructions. In early spring, work will need to be done on the trail to repair the damage.

35
36 Parrish Trail had baby head rocks removed to make it a clear path. A connector trail was
37 made from the Parrish Trail over to the Sunset Trail, and a reverse water bar was installed to
38 remove water from the trails. There are cougars that use this trail on a regular basis, and trees still
39 need to be cut back on the trail.

40
41 **REPORT ON UTAH OUTDOOR RECREATION GRANT**

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43 Bruce Cox reported he went to a workshop recently, and he will be applying for the
44 Outdoor Recreation Grant. This is a federal grant that funds restrooms and parking lots, and usually
45 grant usually combines with a state grant.




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3 The next Parks and Recreation Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, December
