We are excited about our July 4th celebration this year! The Fourth of July Committee has been stalwart as state and county COVID-19 requirements eliminated one traditional activity after another. I want to express my heartfelt appreciation to Councilman Bill Ince, along with Brian and Kim Curnow (as well as others from the surrounding communities) for their tireless efforts to help make this happen not only for our city, but the entire county! We are thrilled to present a truly unique event: "**The Davis County Independence Day Air Parade**." We encourage everyone to take an American flag to their front yards at 9:00 a.m. (please maintain social distancing) and join together as neighbors, as we invite all to recite the Pledge of Allegiance in celebration of this great country. Then, look up as we will be privileged to view a parade in the sky! Every 15 minutes or so, another specialized aircraft will fly overhead, concluding with a parachutist in each city. The new Island View Park in the southeast part of town will open at the end of June. New playground equipment and tennis and pickleball courts are some of the highlights. With additional fundraising, we hope to add more pickleball courts in other areas of the city in the future.

#### **Summer Road Construction Info**

Centerville City has a few road projects that are currently under way or will be started soon. Expect road closures and detours. Check the City website for project information and updates.

- The two street rebuild projects located on 400 East
   Parrish Lane to 100 South and Casa Loma Drive Main Street to 325 East will continue through the
  summer. Currently the water lines are being installed.
  It is anticipated that the contractors will finish their
  part of the rebuild in mid-July allowing the street
  rebuilds to begin with the goal of completion being in
  August.
- A bike lane will be installed on South Frontage Road.
- Annual crack seal and slurry seal will be done in various locations throughout the City. Contractors will notify residents affected before work begins.

### **Audit Committee**

This service has especially been beneficial over the past few months due to the restrictions caused by Covid-19, as it has allowed the city to continue to conduct city business when it has been most needed. ## STATUS OF CENTERVILLE CITY SERVICES AND EVENTS

Centerville City Hall is now open. We will be taking precautions at City Hall with limited access to certain areas and continued sanitation in common areas. We encourage residents to wear a mask when entering City Hall, stay at home if you are sick, and to continue practicing social distancing by keeping a six-foot distance from others in the building. If possible, please still use online services and call in for questions.

The Public Works building has added a window to serve residents regarding Public Works and Community Development. This window will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, although this is subject to change.

Our Police Department window will now be open from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and will resume fingerprinting services on Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

For now, our Court will remain closed until further notice.

## 2019 Water Quality Report

Each year Centerville City is required to publish a Drinking Water Quality Report and make it available to all customers. It shows the test results for microbiological, inorganic and radioactive contaminants. Centerville's drinking water complies with all applicable standards. Testing for contaminants occurs on a regular basis - either daily, weekly, monthly, annually or every three years - depending on the substance. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Please remember that Centerville Municipal Code 11.01.130 states that it is unlawful to hamper pedestrian or vehicular traffic on the sidewalk, gutter, or within the street next to such premises. 

## **Fireworks Information and Restriction Map**



The allowed days for discharging legal fireworks are from July 2nd – July 5th and from July 22nd – July 25th from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. On July 4th and July 24th fireworks may be discharged until midnight.

Due to the extreme danger of wildland fires, Centerville City has prohibited the discharge of fireworks on the east bench. The Firework Restriction map shows this restricted area.

You may only use fireworks that are legally sold at retail stores in Utah that are designed for consumer use. These are labeled as "Class C Common" or sometimes marked "1.4G." Any fireworks that have the designation "Class C Dangerous Explosives" are illegal.
