22 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

23  
24 Minutes of the May 17, 2018 meeting were reviewed. Mikael Remington made a **motion**  
25 to approve the minutes as written. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by  
26 unanimous vote (3-0).

28 **COMMITTEE MEMBERS**

29  
30 Brandon Frederico has resigned as a member of the Trails Committee. The Committee  
31 discussed names of possible candidates to fill the position.  
32

33 **REPORT OF ANY RECENT OR UPCOMING TRAILS PROJECTS**

34  
35 Rick Turner was not able to attend the meeting, but he left notes with Mikael Remington  
36 regarding trail projects.  
37

38 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported a “T” post fence and yellow plastic??  
39 needs to be installed along the 3,000-foot dike area to keep motorcycles from going beyond the  
40 east barrier. This will require 300 “T” posts, and it could be an Eagle Scout project for two to three  
41 scouts.

43 **JULY 4<sup>TH</sup> ASSIGNMENTS**

44  
45 The Trails Committee agreed they will not have a 4<sup>th</sup> of July booth.

1                   **HILLSIDE IMPROVEMENT UPDATE**

2  
3                   Steve Thacker, City Manager, distributed the Management Plan for the City Foothill  
4 Property. A report was given today from the City Engineer on the drainage study, and a preliminary  
5 review will be given to the City Council at the July 17<sup>th</sup> meeting. A map was displayed showing  
6 foothills area. The drainage water must be controlled and intercepted on the road to the gun range.  
7 A drainage pipe can be installed to take the water to the creek that could build up behind the dike  
8 and erode the access road. Mark Oligschlaeger reported on the improvements Farmington has  
9 made on the road in Farmington Canyon up to Francis Peak that was paved with magnesium  
10 chloride at a seemingly reasonable cost.

11  
12                   Mr. Thacker said a technical group will do an analysis of the specific improvements that  
13 need to be completed. March is the application deadline for the state outdoor recreation grant that  
14 may provide some funds for the bike trails. At the end of 2018, a Master Plan will be created to  
15 show proposed uses on the City's property. Mark Oligschlaeger reported Fruit Heights got their  
16 application approved for the outdoor recreation grant to build their trails. The county matched the  
17 grant for Fruit Heights. A survey of hillside users on the weekend was taken a few months ago,  
18 and the majority of responders want hillside improvements. A survey needs to be taken of weekday  
19 users. At end of year, the trails alignment will again be reviewed before final approval is given for  
20 the hillside improvements.

21  
22                   Mark Oligschlaeger would prefer to get a mix of State, County, and private money to start  
23 the hillside trails project next year. Mr. Thacker explained the road-related infrastructure should  
24 be improved before the trails are constructed, in his opinion.

25  
26                   Regarding the Active Transportation Study, Wasatch Front Regional Council will be  
27 involving the three cities with the staff member from WFRC to go through an RFP process to  
28 select a consultant to do the study.

29  
30                   Mr. Thacker talked to Alex Roy of WFRC and he will contact UDOT on when a decision  
31 has to be made about bike striping on Main Street. The current Main Street project does not address  
32 a connection to the Legacy Trail via Parrish Lane. The intent is to have the WFRC Representative  
33 give advice on striping and the connections among the cities. Mark Oligschlaeger expressed  
34 concern that the timeline for completing the foothills Master Plan is too long and there needs to be  
35 more momentum in the process.
