21 **WELCOME NEW MEMBER**

23 Shawna Dickamore was welcomed as a new member of the Trails Committee. She lives in
24 north Centerville, and she and her family enjoy hiking and four-wheeling.

26 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

27
28 Minutes of the February 21, 2019 meeting minutes were reviewed. Blair Parrish
29 made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was
30 passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

31
32 **HILLSIDE PLAN**

33
34 Jake Layton, Trails Committee Chair, gave a brief description of the plans to make
35 mountain bike trails and multi-use trails on the 180 acres below the "V" on the hillside. An aerial
36 photo of the mountainside was viewed. An open house was previously held for the public to give
37 input on the proposed plans, and the County may contribute towards the funding of the trails. One
38 trailhead will be located at Twin Hollow Park in Bountiful.

40 **SELECT TWO HILLSIDE MANAGEMENT AD HOC COMMITTEE MEMBERS**

41
42 Jake Layton explained there is an Ad Hoc Committee being formed that will make
43 recommendations for mountain side recreational uses. Robyn Mecham, City Council Liaison, said
44 two people will be chosen to be on this Committee. Mark Oligschlaeger will be one of the members
45 of the Ad Hoc Committee, and Sunny Larson will be asked to be on this committee.

1 The Public Works Director was concerned about water drainage and run-off on the hillside, so a
2 study was conducted on the drainage by the City Engineer. The findings of the report concluded
3 that the concerns addressed can be taken care of during the construction of the trails. The first
4 phase is to install a drainage line that will run through the bottom dike area.

5
6 **INVITATION TO FRUIT LOOPS OR OTHER TRAIL SYSTEM WITH TREK**
7 **DEMO BIKES**
8

9 Jake Layton explained Fruit Loops is the Fruit Heights trail system that was constructed
10 last year on the mountains above Fruit Heights. Centerville's City Council has been invited to
11 attend a field trip using TREK demo bikes by a representative from the new Centerville TREK
12 store. It is hoped the Fruit Loop trail system will eventually connect to Kaysville and Farmington's
13 trail system. Robyn Mecham, City Council Liaison, will inform the City Council of the TREK
14 demo bike invitation, and plan a date to ride this trail system.

16 At 8:53 p.m., Mikael Remington arrived at the meeting.

18 Mikael Remington reported the majority of the grades for the proposed Centerville hillside
19 trails are identical to the shoreline trails, which are gentle, rolling trails.

21 **VOLUNTEER PROJECTS REPORT**

23 There was no information to report on this item.

25 **TRAIL DAMAGE AND REPAIR**
26

27 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported the Rotary Club will be repairing the
28 rope and fence posts where there are breeches on the east boundary line above the dike area. There
29 has been trail damage caused by horses walking on trails when they are wet at the Deuel Creek
30 Bridge area. The road leading to the mine is in terrible condition, and is in need of major repairs.
31 The mine opening should be closed and the area blocked off, as it has become dangerous and
32 unsafe. There are rattle snakes in the mine and it is sinking.

34 Committee members were asked to observe areas on the trails that are in need of repair
35 where a volunteer project could do repair work.


39 Mikael Remington would like to have a trail run, similar to the trails runs that were

43 park.


